




# **Cell phones and Electronic Devices:**

Students may not use cell phones, hand-held electronic games, etc., at school during school hours, including recess and lunchtime, unless used in the classroom for educational or medical purposes – approved by the teacher. If students are found using these devices for any other purposes, they will be asked to put them away and then potentially confiscated and kept at the office until the end of the school day for repeat offences. Further offences may require calling parents to collect the device from the office. Teaching digital citizenship, when it is appropriate to use phones and devices is ultimately our goal at school.









# **Declaration of Aboriginal Ancestry**

Are your children descendants of First Nations, Metis or Inuit Peoples?

If yes, they qualify for additional services through funding from the Ministry of Education. This funding is used by the district to provide programs and services which include cultural, academic, social and emotional support for students as well as district wide cultural events, resources, leadership opportunities, and celebrations. Parents/guardians only need to self-identify to qualify for this funding, status is not a requirement. If your child is of Indigenous Ancestry, please contact the school and we will provide you with the required forms.



### Code of Conduct 2023-24

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

To provide a respectful, caring, and safe environment at Tuc-el-Nult Elementary School.

- Behaviours that:
  - demonstrate respect for self, others, and the school

  - inform adults about incidents of bullying, harass
  - show involvement in learning activities
  - show consideration for being on time

    - a place that is 'discrimination free" as defined by sections 7 and 8 of the Human Rights Code(Including but not limited to: race, colour, amostry, place of origin, religion, family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, sexual orientation, age)
       a place that honours School District S3 Student Conduct & Discipline Policy (F-3)

### Behaviours that:

### Acts of:

- possession, use, or distribution of illegal or restricted substances

   theft or damage to property

- increasing personal responsibility and self-discipline

- responses to unacceptable conduct are consistent and feir
   disciplinary action relates to the infraction and is preventat
- disciplinary action relates to the infraction and is preventative and restorative in nature, in line with School District 53 Student Conduct & Discipline Policy (F-3).

   school officials
- police &/or other agencies

We work cooperatively and make change for the greater good like ?araik\* (Turtia).


